

Baboon climbed around the zoo some more and met Tiger. "Good afternoon," said Baboon.




- "Hi," said Tiger. "I'm going to take a nap. Would you like to take one, too?"

 "Good afternoon," said Baboon.




"Well, hello there," said Raccoon.
