

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"Stefan Is a Sculptor



"I like to read books about stars and planets. I like to read books about shapes."




- "What is this work about?" the girl asked. Stefan grinned.

- "This is about a family," said Stefan. "Which one do you like best?"




"What does this writing say?" a boy asked. Stefan helped the boy read the writing on his sculpture.
