### **Vocabulary lesson 1: personality 9<sup>th</sup> grade**

1-personality: person's character

2-clever: intelligent , quick at learning and understanding.

3-talkative: chaterbox , liking to talk a lot

4-upset: unhappy or disappointed from unpleasant things that have happened

5-funny: amusing causing laughter.

6-neat: a person that is tidy and likes keeping things in order.

7-patient: calm, doesn't lose temper for waiting

8- serious: thoughtful, not silly, a person who is not funny and doesn't joke.

9-brave: not afraid, willing to do dangerous things.

10-rude: impolite

11-cruel: some one that enjoys the suffering of others, a person that isn't kind and causes pain and trouble to others.

13- Selfish: thinking about your own needs, not others wants

14-studious: some body that spends a lot of time on studying/reading.

15-helpful: a person that helps others or likes helping others.

16-generous: kind, some one that gives its things to others.

17-Polite: respectful, having good manners and showing respect for others.

## Vocabulary lesson 2: travel 9<sup>th</sup> grade

1-trip: usually a short journey to a place for pleasure

2-journey: traveling from a place to another

3-travel: go from one place to another(specially over a long distance)

4-check in: to go to a hotel desk and tell you've arrived.

5-check out: pay your bill at hotel and then leave

6-baggage reclaim: the place at an airport where you collect your suitcases after a flight<reclaim: regain/ repossess>

7-pack(for a trip): put your needed things in your bag before going somewhere.

8-Toll: tax paid for using a road , bridge ,etc.

9-exchange (money): change your money from a currency to another.

10-weigh: to measure how heavy s.th is, scale.

11-fill out (the form): write all necessary information on the official document.

12-book (ahotel):to make an arrangement to stay in a hotel at a particular time

13- reserve: to keep a part to use for special purposes in the future

14-passport: small official document that proves who you are to the security guard before exiting or entering a country taken from the government.

15-receptionist: desk clerk

16- tourist: s.b. who is visiting a place for pleasure or holiday

17-gift shop: shop that sells small things related to a special place that are suitable to give as gifts.

18-ticket: a piece of paper that shows you had paid your money to enter a cinema, train, plane, etc.

19- timetable: a list of times that shows when s.th starts or finishes; in travel it shows when busses, trains, planes, boats, ships, etc. arrive and leave.

20- take off: to rise into the air from ground.

21- land: to move safely from the air onto the ground.

22- currency: money in use in a country.

23- board: to get on a vehicle like airplane.

24- make a voyage: to take a trip on water specially by ship

25- hotel: a place in a city of a country where tourists stay in it during their trip.

### Vocabulary lesson 3: festivals and ceremonies 9<sup>th</sup> grade

1-festival: a day or period when people stop working to celebrate a special event, often a religious one.

2-ceremony: an official gathering to celebrate, commemorate and etc. to mark an important event.

3-recite: say a poem, etc. aloud for a ceremony

4-celebrate:A) perform/participate (a religious ceremony), in particular officiate at (the Eucharist). \* Eucharist: شکرگزاری - officiate: به جا آوردن

B) to show that a day or an event is important by doing s.th. special on it.

5-anniversary: a date that is an exact number of years after the date of a special event.

6- national anthem: official song of a nation(country)

7-military parade: formal gathering of soldiers in order to march in front of people

8-fire work: a device containing burning powders that makes bright coloured lights, and loud noise, when burned in festivals.

9-culture: the customs and beliefs, art, way of life and social organization of particular country or national or special group.

10-martyr: a person who suffers so much or is killed because of their religious or political beliefs.

11-commemorate: to remind people of an important event/person from the past (with a special reason/work)

12- holiday: an extended period of leisure and recreation, especially one spent away from home or in travelling, vacation.
